2. Ask several volunteers to read Acts 3:1-10. What stands out to you in this story?

3. If the man in this story had asked you for money, how do you think you would have responded: a) ignored him, b) given him some pocket change, c) prayed for him to find an appropriate job, d) prayed for his healing, or e) spoken his healing into being and taken his hand to help him up?
4. Peter had probably walked by this lame man dozens or even hundreds of times before. How do you think he knew that God wanted to do something different this time, to give this man the treasure of healing?
5. How would you explain to someone that healing in the Kingdom of God is a treasure in your life?
6. Do you see healing as an integral or as an optional part of Christianity? Explain.
7. Where are you regarding the concept of the excluded middle? (The excluded middle is the realm of the supernatural – Holy Spirit, angels, demons, miracles, etc. – that exist between the realm of God and the realm in which we live.)
8. Where are you currently and where do you believe God wants you to be in regard to healing?
9. Where do you struggle to walk in this treasure of healing? How can we pray for you?
10. After a time of worship break into smaller groups and pray for one another, being sensitive and open to the Holy Spirit. Pray for one another's healing.
